Treasurer's Report

The treasurer's report was reviewed and discussed; no corrections were made. Rus Ogburn made a motion to accept the Treasurer's

report for audit review, seconded by Ann Slifco. Motion approved.

Jim Darr reported that an audit review for July through December 2023 was performed on Saturday, February 17th by the audit committee and all was found in good standing.

Pulpit Supply report

Tom Croner reported that the pulpit is scheduled through the second quarter of this year.

Standing Committees Reports

- A. <u>Fellowship and Funeral</u> It was reported that Lewis Berkley visitation with the family and Funeral will be held at the church on Saturday, March 30th with the visitation being 3:00 – 5:00pm with the funeral service at 5:00pm. A request was made by the family to have beer and wine at the funeral dinner in our social room. A motion was made by Gale Hay, seconded by Leanna Coughenour to allow wine only at the dinner <u>for this</u> <u>event only</u> with the family to supply the wine and a liability waiver on the families insurance for this event. <u>Motion approved.</u>
- B. <u>Hugs and Kisses</u> Amanda Custer reported that the Hugs and Kisses are having a lock-in in the church social room on Saturday, March 16th with pizza, baking cookies, Bible Bingo, a movie and putting together items for the shut-ins. Next meeting for the Hugs and Kisses is scheduled for April 2nd.
- **C.** <u>Property</u> Jim Darr reported that the property committee met at the parsonage to see what needs done to prepare for a new minister in the future. It

was determined that the master bath needs remodeled. A motion was made by Rus Ogburn, seconded by Gale Hay to present to the congregation for approval the renovation of the master bathroom and closet not to exceed \$20,000. <u>Motion approved.</u>

Bill Landis volunteered to do the prayer for the next meeting of the consistory.

It was reported that we can use our one call service to notify members of any new information. We will need to contact all members to verify that our information on addresses and phone numbers are up to date to use this service. Jean Hart reported that she would like to get our youth involved in a mission project. She has contacted several farmers to see if the youth could glean farm produce after it has been picked by the farmers such as potatoes and sweet corn. The youth would pick what is left and bag the produce on a Tuesday evening and then give the produce to the food pantry to be distributed on Wednesday. Also, if they could get a plot of land to grow produce and give the produce to the food pantry. This is all in the beginning stages but it would be a good project for the youth to get involved in and to learn giving to others.

History of the Bible

On so many levels, the Bible is an extraordinary book, from its diverse content and literary styles to its miraculous preservation down through the ages. While the Bible is certainly not the oldest book in history, it is the only ancient text with existing manuscripts that number in the thousands.

In ancient days, the authors of the Bible recorded its messages with whatever resources were available at the time. The Scriptures themselves reveal some of the materials used: engravings in clay, inscriptions on <u>tablets of stone</u>, ink and papyrus, vellum, parchment, leather, and metals.

For a long period in <u>the history of the Bible</u>, common men and women were forbidden access to the Scriptures and their lifetransforming truths. The first full copy of the Bible was completed in the Greek language around A.D. 312. It was called the Codex Vaticanus, as it was kept in the Vatican library. By 405 A.D., Jerome had translated both Old and New Testaments into Latin, which the Catholic church made the official language of the Bible in A.D. 600. It wasn't until the 16th century that the entire Bible was translated into English.

Today the Bible is the best-selling book of all time, with billions of copies distributed throughout the world in more than 2,400 languages.

How is the United Church of Christ Organized?

In United Church of Christ polity, the basic unit of governance is the congregation. Our pastor enters into a covenantal relationship with us and provides leadership and expertise. The denomination provides guidance and resources, but the congregation makes decisions about our life together. Each church is autonomous in government, with elders, deacons and a minister or ministers.

We are part of the Penn West Conference, which includes 99 local churches of the United Church of Christ. The Conference is divided into 6 geographical Associations. Each Association has

its own constitution/bylaws, Association gatherings/meetings, governing board and various committees.

There are 36 conferences in the General Synod of the UCC. The General Synod is comprised of delegates, either clergy or lay, from the 36 conferences, with each conference assigned a minimum of three delegates, regardless of its membership size.
