## What Is Pentecost Sunday

Pentecost Sunday is a significant day in the Christian liturgical year that commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ, as described in the second chapter of the Acts of the Apostles. This event took place during the Jewish festival of Shavuot, fifty days after Easter Sunday, hence the name "Pentecost," which means "fiftieth" in Greek.

The worship on Pentecost Sunday is marked by a celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit, which is considered the birthday of the Church, as it was on this day that many people were baptized and became believers in Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit's arrival empowered the apostles to speak in various languages, symbolizing the universal nature of the Church's mission. During Pentecost worship services, churches often read the account from Acts 2, where a sound like a mighty rushing wind filled the house, and divided tongues as of fire appeared and rested on each of the apostles. The congregation may also sing hymns that focus on the Holy Spirit and its work in the Church and the world. The liturgical color for the day is typically red, symbolizing the fire of the Spirit.

The significance of Pentecost lies in the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to send the Holy Spirit to guide, teach, and empower his followers. It's a day to reflect on the role of the Spirit in personal faith and the collective mission of the Church to spread the gospel to all nations.

Throughout the study, Andy Stanley unpacks the qualities Jesus prescribed for his followers that made them unique. What if believers today embodied these traits and put them before all others?
