Pastor's Ponderings

Another year of service has come and gone and on July $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ I begin my $\mathbf{5}^{th}$ year of service here at Trinity Church. Time flies when you are having fun.

I was thinking back as I begin my 35th year as a parish pastor, I began my service as a pastor in Christ's holy church in the United Methodist Church – East Ohio Conference when I was appointed by the late Bishop James S. Thomas to Brokensword and Lykens UMC near Bucyrus, Ohio. Two very small congregations in rural mid-Ohio which have both now closed. The Lykens Church is now a private residence, and the Brokensword Church remains an abandoned property.

I moved into the parsonage at Brokensword and was immediately faced with a contaminated well. An underground cistern was available and monthly 2,000 gallons of water was delivered to the parsonage for my use. Several times while taking a shower the cistern would run dry leaving me covered in soap. Fortunately, my neighbor next door was the pastor of a church in Bucyrus and I could go there too finish my shower. The residence also was surrounded by crop land and the farmer prepared those areas with some very aromatic fertilizer. I remember some of the kindest people who were part of both congregations who took me as a 23-year-old "kid" under "their wings" to teach me the ropes of being a parish pastor. I learned the value of visiting with folks in various settings, being available for funerals, and helping with church meals and projects. The lesson of work with us, don't just give orders and expect others to do it, built relationships. I also learned patience when daily I would receive a phone call from one parishioner who would give me her daily medical update. . .oh the things I learned and wish I could forget.

Over the years there have been building projects, renovations of parsonages, mission trips, fund raising events, Bible studies, Lenten services, Vacation Bible School, Ministerial meetings, Association meetings, Conference meetings, and so much more. The best parts of ministry were and remain those places where I sense God's pleasure in what I am doing. When I receive a call from a former parishioner who calls to say "thank you" – it makes my heart soar.

Here at Trinity we are coming out of the last 16 months of being apart due to a pandemic. This past Sunday when worship began at 9 a.m., it was wonderful to see everyone back together once again. There was such chatter, smiles, and laughter in the building. There was never a class in seminary about what to do in a pandemic. It was wonderful to hear all of the voices of the congregation raised in singing "The Doxology" with joy.

I am looking forward to the Church Picnic [I've got my Super Soaker ready for the kids], Vacation Bible School with dinner being served "alfresco," special music as part of the Sunday worship service and engaging with folks at various events.

As we move into this 5th year, may we enjoy the favor of God on our ministry together.


